The reason I do and will continue to do the Fox Valley Motorcycle Show the first Sunday of June each year, is in memory of my infant son Derrick Douglas Kienast, who we lost 25 years ago on June 6th 1985 at four months old, to a heart disease that today, because of the great advancements in pediatric heart treatment, could have been saved.
